

HOW TO APPLY FOR A WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK VICTORIAN RESIDENTS

To be allowed to volunteer or work with children in South Australia you need to hold a Working with Children Check (WWCC). A WWCC is valid for five years.

It is an offence to do child-related work without a WWCC.

Volunteers do not have to pay for their WWCC. Hosting is recognised as volunteer work.

HOW TO APPLY

If you are unsure if you already have a WWCC or a valid WWCC you can conduct a WWCC search. Visit <u>South Australia Working with Children</u>

<u>Checks Website</u> and follow the instructions under the "Before You Apply" heading to conduct a search.

If you do not have a WWCC then applying for a WWCC can be done online. You will need to have some of your identification documents handy to complete the WWCC application and for your identity to be proven and verified. Visit <u>Apply For A Screening Check</u> and under the heading "Verify Your ID" you will find the information regarding which



identification documents are needed.

Next visit the <u>South Australia Working with Children Checks Website</u> to apply. Under the "Who Can Apply" heading click on the "Apply for a Screening Check" link to start your application.

Your can check the status of your application by visiting <u>Check The Progress Of Your Application</u> and entering your WWCC application number.
